





First Europe Proposal

Subject: Proposal on Sources of Information (RDA 2.2.2)

Abstract

The following proposal covers three aspects of RDA 2.2.2 (Preferred Source of Information), which came up in the German-speaking community during the implementation of RDA. Accordingly, the proposal is subdivided into three parts.

1. Resources Consisting of Moving Images

1.1 Background

For moving image resources, RDA 2.2.2.3 stipulates to "use the title frame or frames, or title screen or screens, as the preferred source of information". However, actually playing such a resource is a highly unusual practice in the German-speaking community, and only used in rare cases. On the one hand it is felt that routinely playing the resource





